Lenten Season Reflection

Lent is a time of contemplation, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter.

Ephesians

Description:

Around 2,000 years ago the apostle Paul wrote a letter to new followers of Jesus in and around the city of Ephesus. Some were Greek and some were Roman who weren't familiar with the Hebrew God.

They were new to the idea of one God.

Paul wants them to know they are as much a member of God's family as anyone else. He also wants to tell them what it looks like to live their lives as Jesus followers. We'd be wise to pay attention to what he tells the churches in and around Ephesus, because Paul's words to them can still very much apply to us today.

SB Collective. The Collective, which consists of United Methodist clergy and congregations in the SB area will focus on housing insecurity.

Evangel Heights will host the next SB Collective on **March 10, 2024** at 4pm. At that meeting, there will be discussion about the support roles to help others with housing. Rev. Brian Durand of Clay UMC will discuss the different ways people can get involved. Another topic for discussion will be the necessity of boundaries and how boundaries can best be communicated.
