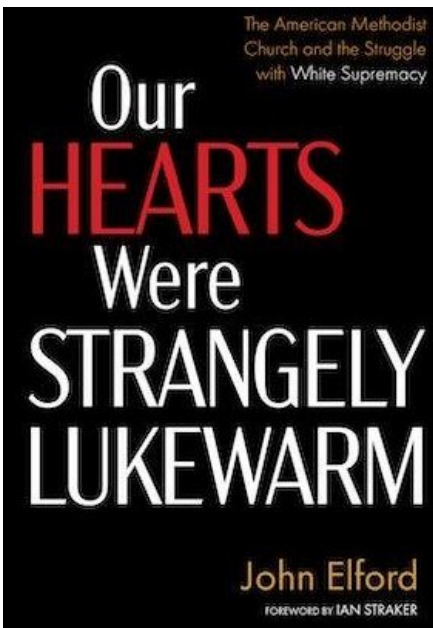

March 10th 4pm at Evangel Heights UMC

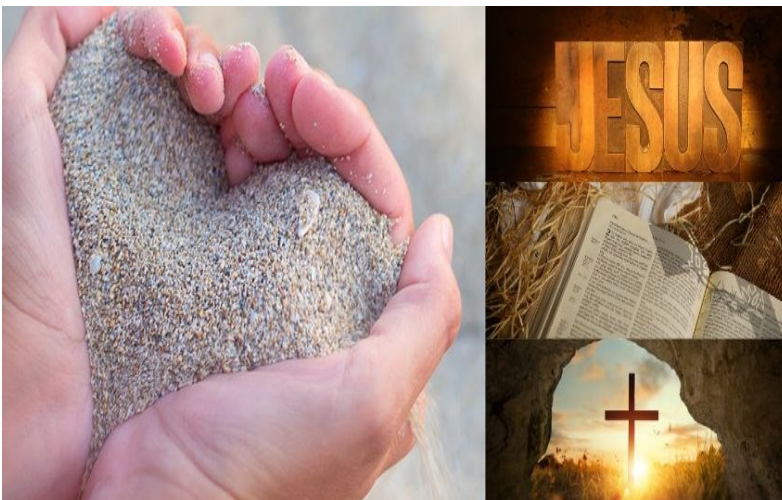
What are the support roles to help others with housing? Clay Pastor Brian Durand will discuss the different ways people can get involved.

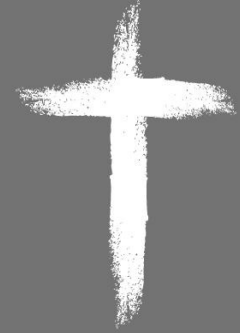

Lenten Season Reflection

Lent is a time of contemplation, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter.

It is a time of self examination and reflection.

As you think about Lent, and prepare for Easter, is there a concern you have? Is there a word that comes to you that describes how you’re feeling right now?

We will have an opportunity to turn our concerns and feelings over to God during the coming season of Lent. There will be notecards in the narthex that you may use to write down what you would like to share with God. It can be anonymous.

There will be a basket on the altar beginning Ash Wednesday, in which you, before or after worship services during Lent, may symbolically cast all your cares and/or joys at Jesus’ feet.
